An Impactful Rezoning Protects Village-owned Open Space

The various Village-owned properties have long been a jewel of undeveloped open space. Now, more of these natural treasures have been rezoned as OS Open Space District.

On October 1st, the Zoning, Planning and Appeals Commission (ZPA) held a public hearing about the potential rezoning of these properties, which include 5 parcels totalling over 122 acres. Subsequently, the ZPA made the recommendation to change the zoning from R1 Single Family District to OS Open Space District.

On October 15th, 2024, the Village Board approved this rezoning. By officially designating this land as protected open space, the Mayor and Board of Trustees have greatly strengthened our Village's stewardship of open space.

Mayor Urlacher noted, "The Village Board continues to prioritize open space. We understand that residents call Mettawa home because they value our unique rural environment and lifestyle." Continued on Page 2

The Village's Comprehensive Plan, The Open Lands Report of 2015, lays out the priority and framework for conservation of properties. Rezoning these parcels ensures the land will only be used in accordance with the Zoning Code's requirements for the Open Space District.

Mettawa has long been known for proximity to forest preserves and access to beautiful wide views. This rezoning is a significant step forward to reinforce our Village's roots and protect our future as a low density, rural community. 🏶

Recent Road Resurfacing


One of the biggest assets the Village owns is the road infrastructure.

Every 15 years or so, we resurface every road. To do that in the most cost effective way, we have to make sure we preserve the roadbed underneath the asphalt.

It is significantly cheaper to just be able to shave off the first few inches of asphalt and replace it with a fresh layer. We then gain another 15 years of usability.

The crack sealing we implemented this year will help stop the existing cracks from spreading and deteriorating that causes potholes.

More importantly, we have protected the roadbed underneath from getting damaged from water and salt intrusion 🏶

All applications have been received and processed and the checks will be mailed out on Monday, November 25th.



New 5.5 Mile Trail

The fall is a great time for Mettawa residents to enjoy our trail system and I'm excited that Lake County is creating a new 5.5 mile trail for residents to explore.

This off-road path will run along Route 137 from Independence Grove to the Great Lakes Naval station. Engineering and design work are being done now and construction is expected to begin in 2027.
